



Toepfer Bridge Trail Crossing

The Highlands Ranch Metro District is constructing a pedestrian bridge extending across Dad Clark Gulch connecting the Tresana neighborhood on the east side of the gulch to the Dad Clark Trail and Toepfer Park on the west. In conjunction with the pedestrian bridge, the Metro District is constructing a small erosion control and water quality structure in the gulch.

The work associated with this project will preserve the mature trees in the area. As part of the work some trees under six inches in diameter will be removed, and some trees in the direct path of the pedestrian bridge will be trimmed back.

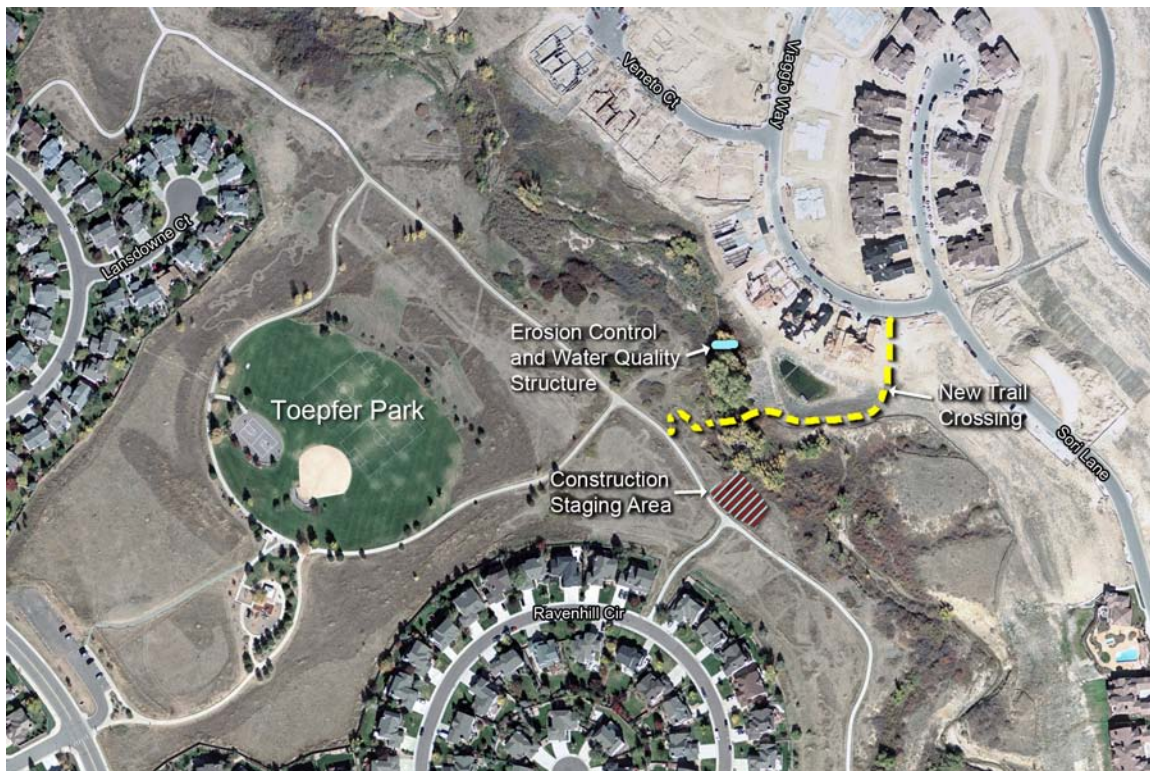
Owls and red tail hawks call this area home. Every effort is being made to minimize the disturbance to wildlife and vegetation in this area.

Equipment and materials for the project will be stored at a staging area on the east side of the Dad Clark Trail. The Dad Clark Trail will remain open throughout the construction period. Contractors will access the area via E. Raven Hill Circle on the west, and Viaggio Way on the east.

This project should be complete by July 2010, weather permitting.
