



Fishing Opportunities in Highlands Ranch

The Highlands Ranch Metro District has two locations where residents can enjoy a day of fishing. They are located at Redstone Park and Cheese Ranch Historic & Natural Area. The Redstone Park Pond is located in one of the District's largest parks and is easily accessible from a nearby parking lot. The pond at Cheese Ranch is a smaller neighborhood fishing pond accessible by trails.

Redstone Park Pond is located on Town Center Drive accessible by Lucent Blvd. to the east and Santa Fe Dr. to the west. Enter Redstone Park at its eastern-most entrance off Town Center Drive and park in the lot closest to the playground area. The pond can be found just east of the playground.

The pond at Cheese Ranch Historic & Natural Area is tucked into a neighborhood north of University and south of Gleneagles Village Parkway. To find the pond, take Crosspointe Drive north from University and turn right on Sugarstone Circle. Park along Sugarstone Circle and walk to Cheese Ranch Historic & Natural Area via one of two trail spurs accessible along Sugarstone Circle.
