

Douglas County Kinship Navigator Program



Are you caring for a grandchild, niece, nephew, cousin or other relative children in your home?

The Douglas County Kinship Navigator Program works to support families who have taken in and are caring for a relative's child. This collaborative program between Douglas County Department of Human Services and Family Tree connects eligible families with community services and assistance to help address the challenges of caring for a relative's child.

Services and referrals – The program provides referrals to community resources that are available to help meet your family's needs and increase your stability, such as:

- Food assistance
- Medical referrals
- Budgeting assistance
- Child's clothing and bed
- Job training and education
- Housing assistance referrals
- Mental Health Services
- Child's extracurricular activities

Who can participate? – Program participants must reside in Douglas County and be a relative caretaker of a child who receives "child-only TANF" or a "TANF Eligible" family receiving services through the County.

How does the program work? – Family Tree will work to determine your eligibility for additional services. Our case manager will schedule a time to visit with you and the child(ren) in your home which allows us the opportunity see how we can best help.
