

Eagle Scout Program, Application & Checklist

The Highlands Ranch Metro District partners with the Boy Scouts of America to help scouts achieve Eagle Scout status. Eagle Scouts are recognized as a select group of men who are outstanding in all that Scouting represents.

Scouts are invited to apply to the Metro District's Eagle Scout Program where they will be responsible for a project from concept to completion that benefits the Metro District and the community. The Scout will be required to demonstrate leadership skills through proper planning and execution of the project. Metro District staff work with Eagle Scout candidates to identify an appropriate project in the following ways:



- 1. The Eagle Scout candidate may select an identified project in which the Metro district has outlined established criteria, or;
- 2. The Eagle Scout candidate may submit a project proposal for consideration to the Metro District. The Scout must be prepared to discuss the merits of this project as it benefits the Scout, the community and the Metro District.

A Metro District project coordinator will approve the project, sign the Eagle Scout Service Project Workbook and provide the Scout and Scout leader with an evaluation upon completion of the project.

Examples of Eagle Scout projects include:

- Bridges
- Nesting Structures
- Trails

How to Apply

Scouts who are interested in partnering with the Metro District to fulfill their scouting requirements must fill out the following application and mail it to the Metro District, Attn: Open Space, 3280 Redstone Park Circle, Highlands Ranch, CO 80129, or fax it to 303-791-3047.

After the Metro District receives the application, staff will review it and call the Scout to schedule a meeting to discuss the project. Scouts will be expected to describe their project and must present their project outline at the meeting.

Eagle Scout Project Checklist

After the Metro District receives your application, staff will review it and call you to schedule a meeting with our staff to discuss the Eagle Scout project. Below is a checklist to prepare you for your first meeting with our staff. Please review the checklist and be prepared to present the project outline at this meeting.
The Eagle Scout candidate will be asked to describe the project(s) being proposed. (Be able to discuss a budget, skills and resources required as well as benefits of the project.)
Present the project timeline. (Include deadlines and important dates along the way, if they are known at this point.)
Provide an emergency contact name and number.
If you have a specific project in mind, please include a sketch or illustration of the project.
