

Northridge Park Renewal Phase II

Construction is beginning on the second phase of the Northridge Park renewal with demolition of the retaining walls and basketball court starting the week of Sept. 18. The park's playground and trails will remain open during construction; however, some areas of the park might be fenced off as necessary.

The second phase of the Northridge Park renewal will create a more updated and inviting park for visitors. A new concrete, outdoor table tennis area and full sized bocce ball court will add more recreational opportunities. The full basketball court will be converted into a half-court with extra space for a free throw shooting area. The picnic area will be renovated to be ADA compliant and will feature picnic tables and grills. Sturdier and more attractive retaining walls will replace the deteriorating timber walls. Other updates include regrading the largest field to improve drainage, renovating the irrigation system to be more efficient, and widening the park's interior trails to 8 feet. Construction is expected to be completed by the end of November, weather dependent.

Funding for the project comes from the Metro District's Major Repair Fund and Conservation Trust Fund, with additional money for recreational amenities provided by the Highlands Ranch Park & Recreation Foundation.

Northridge Park is located at 8800 S. Broadway. It is Highlands Ranch's oldest park and was originally built in 1982. Phase one of the renewal was completed in May 2016.
