



Q1 - Approximately how far is Toepfer Park from your home?



Q2 - Can you walk or roll to Toepfer Park from your home?



Q3 - How often do you visit Toepfer Park?




Q4 - On average, how long are your visits to Toepfer Park?






ziplining is his favorite. I'm sure he'd love a climbing wall too! More playground please:) it's a great place for the young kids from the neighborhood to meet.

We need a properly plumbed restroom with separate men/women/family facilities. Although you refer to this as a neighborhood park as opposed to a community park that is a specious description. Often, scheduled youth athletic competitions include teams that have travelled from other counties. People completing a long drive need a sanitary restroom, for sure. But so do my grandchildren and my neighbor's children and grandchildren. Even, immediately after a cleaning the vault toilet is a disgusting experience, particularly for a woman or girl. As I have travelled to parks, playgrounds and athletic fields throughout our state I have observed many communities of much less quality that HR providing far superior sanitary facilities. - I am strongly against changing the space from what it is. I would rather see improvements to the playground and pavilion
- I appreciate the improvement to the baseball field for the young children.
- I have resided in close proximity to Toepfer Park for approximately seven years. As you may already be aware, the main challenge associated with the park is related to parking, particularly with respect to the fields and other recreational areas. Expanding the park to accommodate additional fields and activities could potentially exacerbate traffic flow issues, create further parking complications, and even result in disregard for our properties from individuals who do not reside in Highlands Ranch. Personally, I strongly advocate for the preservation and upkeep of this area to ensure the existing ecosystem, including its diverse range of animals and plants, remains undisturbed. It is essential to consider the impact on this ecosystem before embarking on any destructive endeavors that may displace countless creatures that play crucial roles within our environment and ecosystem. Although this perspective may not be universally popular, I believe it is important to voice my concerns.
- I like that the park offers playground space, open space, and a public bathroom. I would like to see more of the same. Since it is in a neighborhood I would like to keep traffic into and out of the park to a minimum. The neighborhood roads are not designated to handle excessive traffic. The area there is quiet, with an emphasis on nature and less of an emphasis on structured play. It is nice to have a quiet oasis within the area.
- I love hearing the young people as they play soccer, baseball, etc. I am concerned about Pickleball, which has become so

- popular, disturbing the surrounding homes.
- I mainly go to the park with my young kiddos to play! So the playground is the main draw for us!
- I think that the parking lot should be improved. I like the current park and walk there on an almost daily basis. I would prefer that whatever upgrades that are done would not cause a lot of extra traffic on Venneford Ranch road.
- I usually walk through the park. It would be nice to beautify with gardens and benches. Maybe a skate park for kids. A reason to linger instead of just pass through.
- I walk around Toepfer Park about three to four times per week and enjoy it a lot. My two concerns are the poor drainage near the restroom and the periodic vandalism of this restroom. Most of the open area west and south of the restroom drains directly into it causing sediment and dirty water to make it inaccessible. This problem can be easily solved with some simple grading, and pipe or chase drains under the crusher fines path. The flows could then be allowed to slowly spread out and seep into the soils. The vandalism is a more difficult problem. Possibly several monitoring cameras would help to discourage or else identify the vandals. I have witnessed the aftermath of the flooding and the vandalism twice in the last three years.
- I would first off prefer for the space to stay as open space.
 Alternatively, a nature play and education area with small trails, trees, plants, etc would be fun and beautiful! Would like there to be a large buffer from any development and the homes near Weatherstone circle. Distance and trees would be preferred. We enjoy our quiet park and would love to keep it that way!
